

Common Course Outline for: MUSC 2251: Applied Music II**A. Course Description**

1. Number of credits: 2
2. Lecture hours per week: 1
Lab hours per week: None
3. Prerequisites: Successful audition
4. Co-requisites: MUSC 1152: Performance Class
5. MnTC Goals: None

Individual music instruction directed toward preparation of the thirty-minute Sophomore Recital or transfer audition. This course is intended for Associate of Fine Arts in Music candidates, but is open to all students who complete a successful audition and have completed 4 credits of MUSC 1151: Applied Music I. This course may be repeated for a maximum of 4 credits. Prereq: Successful audition. There is an additional fee for this course.

B. Date last reviewed: 3/2017**C. Outline of Major Content Areas**

1. This course includes the development of skills required for performance.
2. The content will include intonation, tone quality, rhythmic accuracy, precision of attack and uniformity of release, clarity of articulation, control of tempo and dynamics, phrasing and style, interpretation and structural analysis, memorization and sight-reading skills.
3. The instructor and student will design a program of repertory that is consistent with the intent of a Sophomore Recital, completion of an AFA in Music, or transfer audition.

D. Course Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the course, the student will be able to:

1. Demonstrate accuracy of intonation and control of tone quality. (MNTC goal 2a)
2. Demonstrate accuracy of attack and release of the tone and precision of articulation and rhythmic accuracy. (MNTC goal 2b)
3. Demonstrate control of tempo, dynamics, phrasing and interpretation. (MNTC Goals 2a, 2b)
4. Demonstrate ability to memorize and sight-read. (MNTC goal 2c)
5. Develop a repertoire of literature for his/her instrument or voice that is appropriate for a Sophomore Recital or transfer audition. (MNTC goal 2d)

6. Demonstrate an efficient practice structure. (MNTC goals 2a, 2b, 2c, 2d)

E. Methods for Assessing Student Learning

1. Weekly evaluation occurs weekly at the arranged lesson time.
2. Students will perform a final exam in front of a jury of music faculty.

F. Special Information:

The fee for applied music is \$425. This fee is in addition to regular tuition. MUSC 1151 may be repeated for credit if satisfactory progress is being made. Instruments must be provided by the student. Normandale provides practice rooms equipped with pianos.
